

Frequently Asked Questions about IV Sedation:

What are the rules of IV Sedation?

- Make sure you are healthy. If any symptoms of a head or chest cold are present prior to your appointment, we may want to reschedule your procedure.
- No eating anything 8 hours prior to appointment. You may drink water, unsweetened tea, or black coffee (no cream or sugar) up until 3 hours prior to the appointment. All other liquids/solids **MUST** be stopped 8 hours prior.
- Dress comfortably. No tight clothes or long sleeved tops as access to the arm is needed for the blood pressure cuff.
- **NO** fingernail polish. Remove all forms of fingernail polish so it does not interfere with the equipment.
- Must have a designated driver. Someone will need to drive you to your appointment and drive you home. This person **MUST** remain in the office or vehicle during the procedure and cannot run any errands during this time. If you are under the age of 19, this must be your parent or guardian.
- Designate a caretaker, we ask that someone remains with you for at least 4 hours following the procedure.
- For 24 hours, no driving, operating machinery (including lawn mowers, tractors, etc...) or power tools.

Will I be awake? What will I hear?

- For IV sedation, you will be in a twilight zone and respond to commands from the doctor. But you will not have to hear any of the normal dental noises that occur. This will be the highest level of sedation and you will leave with no memory of the procedure. Imagine you are sleeping, or very sleepy, but will not remember any of the procedures.
- For laughing gas sedation, or nitrous, you will hear everything, but most of the time you just don't care because you are happy! The laughing gas sedation is very quick onset and quick ending... and so you do not need any driver or help for the procedure.

Will I need a driver?

- For IV sedation you will need a driver before and after the procedure, as well as someone to help bring you home and stay with you for a couple hours after the procedure. The medications that are used in IV sedation make it dangerous for you to be driving afterwards. However, Nitrous, or laughing gas sedation, is very safe and fast, and you can drive yourself to and from the dental appointment.
